whom These Presents Do or May Concern, We, Sir Thomas Innes of Learney, Knight, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Baron of Learney, Kinross, and Leochrie, Doctor of Laws, Advocate, Lord Lyon King of Arms, send Greeting; WHEREAS WILFRED BEVERIDGE Mc INNES, sometime Merchant in Dumbarton, with residence at 254 Morrison Street, Edinburgh, having by Petition unto Us of date 6 April 1959 Shewn; THAT he, the Petitioner, born 14 May 1896, is the second son of Hugh Mc Innes, sheep baillie at Carradale to His Grace the late Duke of Argyll, and his wife Melville, daughter of William Beveridge; WHOSE Hugh Mc Innes died at Dumbarton, aged 74, anno 1944, AND the Petitioner having prayed that there might be granted unto him such Ensigns Memorial as might be found suitable and according to the Laws of Arms; KNOW YE, THEREFORE, that We have Devised, and Do by These Presents Assign, Ratify and Confirm unto the Petitioner and his descendants, and to the other descendants of Hugh Mc Innes, his father, and of his uncles Robert Mc Innes, John Mc Innes, Duncan Mc Innes and Donald Mc Innes, the 1st, 2nd, 4th and 5th sons of the Petitioner's grandfather, with such due and congruent differences as may hereafter be severally matriculated for them the following Ensigns Memorial, as depicted upon the margin hereof, and matriculated if even date with These Presents upon the 73rd page of the 44th Volume of Our Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, videlicet: Quarterly; 1st, per bend Vert and Azure, a castle of two towers Or, port and windows Sables; 2nd and 3rd Or, upon the sea in base undy Azure and Argent, a lymphad Vert, flagged and five visible oars in action Sables; 4th, gyronny of eight Sable and Or; over all a fess indented Purpure charged with three lions' heads cabossed Argent, horned Or, all within a bordure engrailed Sables. Above the Shield is placed an Helm befitting his degree, with a Cresting Azure doubled Or, and on a Wreath of the Lilies is set for Crest a demi-boat Sable, armed and unguled Or, having about its prow a plaid of the proper tartan of the Clan Longhair, videlicet: Yellow 4 (Pivot), Black 24, Vert 4, Black 4, Vert 4, Black 4, Vert 32, Black 6, Azure 6, Black 6, Azure 24, Vert 12, Red 4 (Centre) Vert 12 etc., sustaining in its hooves a bow in draught Vert with an arrow in the string Sables, and in an Escrol over the same this Motto GHEIF DFE AUIS-ON RIGB, by demonstration of which Ensigns Memorial, Insignia of Nobility, he and his successors in the same are, amongst all Nobles, and in all Places of Honour, to be taken, numbered, accounted and received as Nobles in the Noblesse of Scotland IN GESTIONNERY WHERE- OF We have Subscribed These Presents and the Seal of Our Office is affixed hereto at Edinburgh this Fifteenth day of November in the Ninth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth
